WORD REFERENCE

CASPA decided that the word reference for CASPA-auspiced national competitions, e.g. Masters/State Challenge and Australian National Championship, would be that used by the majority of State Associations at that time. If it was an equal number of States playing with different word references, then the host State would determine the word reference to be used.

Please note that the Masters/State Challenge being held in Melbourne in September 2022 will use the CSW19 word reference.

CASPA LEVY

Noting the difficulty in producing printed copies of the magazine and the fact that States had limited means of generating income from tournaments, it was decided that the levy would be \$0 for the quarters of September and December 2022 quarters.

Paul Richards kept the website updated with entries and information, took on a host of other jobs as well as live streaming results. Judy Mason took all the entry forms and fees, made the name tags and organized prize money. Other committee members came together as a team at the tournament to ensure it all ran smoothly. Well, ok the coffee machine was a minor hiccup so thanks for your patience everyone!

It was great to have Phillip Hamilton as our Tournament Director. It was his first foray into doing this job solo and he was calm and organized – well he seemed it at least. He gave me a much needed hug on the first morning as he noticed my stress levels were a little high. I heaved a big sigh of relief when play got under way that first day.

I was a bit wary about how the publicity would go so it was good that both the interview on ABC Breakfast with Tony Hunt (thanks Tony) and the Seven news segment on Monday were done well. Glad to see that Phillip Hamilton got his longed for 5 minutes of fame.

Thank you too for the excellent job done by photographer and player Khwanjai Thammaping. Many of her photos will be here. See who you can spot.

My congratulations to all the winners and all who took home prizes. But the tournament wasn't just about winning. Sure, we all like to pit our brains in this great game and come away with those narrow victories or even a crushing win against a higher rated player. Looking around, especially during breaks in play and seeing the smiles and chatter, it is easy to see that the Nationals are also about making and renewing friendships. It was also heart warming to see the excitement amongst our younger new players. I hope that the face to face Nationals tournaments and others are able to continue giving both challenges and pleasure for many years.

Of course when it was all over, I heaved a big sigh of relief and went home exhausted followed by a week's holiday at the Sunshine Coast. I was sorry to hear that about 14 people also went home with Covid and hope they have all recovered now. The tournament was a lot of work but well worth it. Thanks everyone.

Tournament Roundup

Six rated face-to-face tournaments were held during the quarter as COVID restrictions eased and players cautiously re-entered the scene.

The first tournament to return to its regular spot on the calendar was the annual Wollongong February tournament. 43 players made the trip to Wollongong for the 8 games, but a computer malfunction caused this to be reduced to 7 with many players doubling up on opponents. We welcomed Jeremy Yip, an accomplished Victorian player who had moved to Sydney to work. The winners of the three Divisions were Rod Talbot (A), Jyoti

Chandna (B) and Margaret Berliner (C). Tony Hunt picked up High Game of 558 and High Word of 107 for **WARFARE** in different games.

Next it was a return to the Club Burwood RSL for the Matchplay Qualifier. The top 8 finishers in above and below 1300 rating would go on to contest the one-on-one Matchplay elimination rounds to decide the actual Matchplay champions. After 8 games, the top 3 of the 37 taking part were Rod Talbot, John Holgate and Bob Jackman. Victor Tung recorded the High Game of 558 while Rod Talbot jagged High Word with STIRRING for 135.

Empire Bay on the Central Coast was the location of next tournament on 20th March. This tournament had a ceiling of 1300 ratings, thus keeping out the riffraff. It was family affair in both Divisions with Colleen and Richard Birch taking the honours in A Division with 5 wins each from 7 games, and Denise Smith and her daughter Stephanie Muldoon filling the top 2 placings in B Division.

Two weeks later we headed north again, this time to the shores of the beautiful Lake Macquarie and the Birch residence. 28 players were accommodated with relative ease, including interstate visitor Dianne Brumby and novice Carol Wakelin.

Joanne Craig was a narrow winner over Bob Jackman, both with 7 wins from 8 games and

high margins, with Jyoti Chandna third on 7 wins. High Game went to Joanne with 552 and High Word went to Jyoti with 109 for

FUSTIER.

Nine days later it was Tony Hunt's Out in the Open Open (OITOO), this time at Gunnamatta Park in Cronulla. Therese Nichols making the trip from Wollongong emerged the winner, losing only to Tony Hunt in the sixth and final game. She also recorded the High Game of 535 while junior Patrick Huynh got the High Word Score with 114 for **THANKING.**

Our most recent tournament was the Lane Cove Inaugural on May 15th, capably organised and catered for by Norma Tracey. The general consensus from the 42 players is that the Lebanese food provided for lunch, plus the home baked scones were delicious. This tournament was a first in two ways. It was the first time a multi-level tournament had been attempted, with players fairly evenly split between floors. The paperless draw system enabled draws to be easily conveyed between floors. Also a first for a long while was the presence of 6 novices in C Division, strategically separated from higher Division players on the level below.

Veteran John Holgate was the winner of A Division with 7 wins, by one game and spread over Tony Hunt, relative newcomer John Linney won B Division by half a game over interstate visitor Rob Hutchinson and Josey Mally won C Division by half a game over Jenny Templeton. High Game for the day went to Joanne Craig with 544, while High Word went to youth player Asher Chhabra in B Division, with 140 for **REFUTERS.**

Five tournaments are currently scheduled to take place during the next quarter.

A month later on 5th July will be the OITOO on the Riverbank, a weekday event staged in the open during the school holidays by Tony Hunt, giving our growing youth players an opportunity to play competitively.

On Saturday July 16th it is back to the Collegians club for the Wollongong Round Robin organised by Rene Chelton, then a week later the Scrabble NSW Winter Challenge and Masters will take place in parallel at the Revesby Workers Club over the weekend of 23rd and 24th July.

Finally The Revesby Club Tournament is making a comeback, being organised by Peter Griffiths and having been scheduled for August 7th, also at the Revesby Worker Club.

Youth Scrabble ~ 6th Interschool Scrabble Tournament

NSW Interschool tournament could not proceed in 2020 and 2021 due to Covid restrictions - but 2022 is here and it's back!

The date for the 6th NSW Interschool Scrabble Tournament (Battle of the Brains) has been rescheduled to Thursday 4th August (previously 28th July) due to clash of dates with OC exams.

In the lead up to the tournament, we are inviting students, teachers and approved volunteers from the Scrabble community to meet in a dedicated club room on the Woogles platform for the purpose of building the youth Scrabble community and developing Scrabble skills; these meetings will take place each Saturday evening from 5:30pm up to the date of the Interschool.

We are currently seeking expressions of interest from school aged students and interested teachers to participate in this years event.

At this stage, the Interschool event is only open to students/schools within NSW, however, it is envisioned that the model can be adopted and modified in other states.

This year we are trialing something different with the tournament format. The event is primarily a face-to-face event, but we recognise that for some schools travelling to Cabramatta for a day's Scrabble is impractical or prohibitively expensive. Therefore we will be trialling a Woogles link-in option.

Tisa Ng is working hard following up leads from promotional messages that have been sent out in Department of Education emails.

This involves identifying interested teachers within schools, ensuring they are adequately resourced, ensuring they are aware of avenues to link in with existing youth players and the broader Scrabble community.

Running Scrabble clubs within school hours is demanding due mainly to time constraints.

Twice per month we run after-school Scrabble coaching at a public library from 3:15pm to 5:00pm. This allows for more of a deep-dive into the game, with time for full games to be

played as well as analysis and skills development.

These sessions are currently held at Cabramatta.

I am interested in assisting anyone who would like to set up something similar in their own local area.
